
SOUTH AFRICA

In 2022 we introduced a stakeholder survey to help us understand the sustainability topics that are most important to our stakeholders, including our staff, customers, suppliers, shareholders and community members. The results of this survey indicated that water, emissions, energy, materials and meaningful work were the highest priorities among our stakeholders, closely followed by human rights, waste, our impact on local communities and biodiversity. This tells us that the priorities of our stakeholders are closely aligned to our 'Blueprint' sustainability strategy, which gives us confidence that we are focusing on the right topics for action.



We have used these results to help us build our 2023 Blueprint Action plans. These have been created by our core business functions to ensure that responsibility is fully integrated into our day-to-day operations. The plans are designed to set out what we will do in each of our businesses, to enable us to meet our commitments and ultimately achieve our Blueprint goals of Zero Poverty, Zero Biodiversity Loss, Zero Waste and Zero Emissions.

REVISITING IM MANCHU SECONDARY SCHOOL

IM Manchu Secondary is a school in South Africa which the Foundation supported in 2011 by providing computers. The school serves many in the community where most of the staff live, and the impact of this project has been enormous. IM Manchu is now one of the top schools at Dipaliseng municipality and one of the only schools to obtain 100% pass rate in matric. Matric is the final year of high school and the qualification received on graduating from high school, and the minimum university entrance requirements. This year they have maintained their excellent record and make us proud. It is still the only secondary school that offers computer classes because of the funding provided by the foundation.
