

The School Farm Competition is a project run by the Foundation in Ghana to help reverse the negative image Agriculture has attained. Over 100 schools who participated in the 2022 competition were provided basic farm inputs and training to cultivate their own school farms. The Awards ceremony, which is the climax of the competition saw Kwahu Tafo SHS, winning the Best School Farm of the Year (SHS Category) and Best School Farm of the Year (JHS Category) was awarded to Adoe Basic School in Bono East. Furthermore, the first inclusive school to ever join the competition, Cape Coast School for the Deaf/Blind also took away some prizes while serenading the guests with a beautiful cultural display at the ceremony.
